1. Election of Chair

2. APOLOGIES

3. NOTIFICATION OF SUBSTITUTIONS

Jane Johnstone for Leigh Casling.

4. DECLARATION OF INTERESTS

There were no declarations of interest.

5. MINUTES

The minutes of the meeting held on 20th February were approved as a true record of the meeting.

6. REPORT TO COMMITTEE – Grounds Maintenance

Members received the Grounds Maintenance Report. In Leigh's absence Jane Johnstone went over the pre-repaired report.

6.1 Morris Way Playing Field.

There is a new memorial bench fitted.

The Splash Park is now fully opened and operational after all preparation work was completed.

6.2 **Shenley Playing Field.** 

There was mention of lack of benches. These are mostly rotten and out for repair.

6.3 Napsbury Sports Ground

The cricket square has been prepared for the new season.

The boiler has had some quotes for repair as it is not switching off.

**ACTION -** The roller blocking the way to the external fields to stop walkers is not working. What can we do to stop the parish council spending money to stop walkers? Could we install a kissing gate?

ACTION - Ask Sarah Tallen at HCC for access and to share the cost with HCC

### 6.4 **Allotments**

The grounds staff are currently clearing and tidying the allotments.

**ACTION -** Need to arrange the councillor inspection of allotments and the allotment holders meeting.

### 6.5 **War Memorial – D Day**

**ACTION -** Make sure the war memorial is tidy and ready for D Day Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> June. **ACTION -** Prepare a Facebook post to inform the community of what LCPC are doing for D Day celebrations.

ACTION - Put the D Day flag up at the Caledon Community Centre

# 7. REPORT TO COMMITTEE – Environment and Neighbourhood Officer Matt ran through his report.

### 7.1 Litter Picking

Litter pick on 17<sup>th</sup> March went well. More planned for 30<sup>th</sup> May and 12<sup>th</sup> June. **ACTION** – need more hoops, update the risk assessment, and put on website for more volunteer litter pickers.

**ACTION** – Speak and join the previous LC Litter picking group and look for more stakeholders to join the group.

Fly tipping has been reported via the WhatsApp group and dealt with immediately.

Discussions around the volume of litter behind Sainsburys carpark and the fly tipping up White Horse Lane by Blue Bell Woods.

**ACTION** - There are talks with HCC re sharing a camera to catch fly tippers and how to recoup LCPC costs.

### 7.2 Lowbell Lake Project

More focus on the water quality and biodiversity of the wildlife. There have been reports of lack of wildlife in Broad lakes. This could be due to water quality. Tests can be purchased for £12 for 5 sticks to test the water quarterly.

ACTION - There is a vandalised bench that needs looking at.

**ACTION** – Who owns the road up Lowbell Lane, as its flooding (SADC jane Parker/ HCC)

### 7.3 **Swift Boxes**

Into Phase 2 of project, there are funds left over from phase 1 in Napsbury Park, now to roll out to the rest of the village.

**ACTION** – Can we seek blanket approval from SADC for social housing in London Colney to have swift boxes?

### 7.4 Recycling Update

Blister packs have been dropped off. Now there is options to recycle pens and crisp packets.

There needs to be an overhaul of clothes banks in the village. A new clothes bank around the Caledon Community Centre is now approved.

### 7.5 **Sustainable Saturday**

On 6<sup>th</sup> July we require volunteers to run Sustainable Saturday. This is following Expo in St Albans on 7-9<sup>th</sup> June.

### 7.6 St Albans EXOP

We a have a free stand at the EXPO. This will just have pictures f what environmental projects we have been doing around the village.

### 7.7 SERGO

Sergo are working to mitigate the noise from the construction of the freight station in Park Street. Funds are available to the parish councils (LC and SS). We need to understand how much this is.

**ACTION** – Jane and Matt to contact the clerk in St Stephen's to see if there is a joint venture that can be funded.

**ACTION** – Keith, Vikki and Matt to promote ROW and access t land up to St Alabns.

### 7.8 **Community Garden**

NPMCo have approved the garden with an allotment style community space.

### 7.9 Clean Air Day

20<sup>th</sup> June to take reading from around the village at high omission areas and times (outside schools when parents keep their engines running).

**ACTION** – Sara and Matt to look at signage around the village and a possible article in the next magazine based on the findings of 20<sup>th</sup> June.

### 7.10 Walsingham Way

**ACTION** - Speak to the grounds team about water provisions and grass cutting.

### 7.11 Aviva grants

There are grants available from Aviva for environmental projects.

### 7.12 Playing Out

The concept of closing off a local road so the community can get together and kids can play out for a period of time.

ACTION – Contact a local person who did similar during Covid.

### 7.13 **Glyphosate**

Weed killing substance that is considered bad for the environment.

**ACTION** – speak to the grounds team to see the extent of use in and around the village before any action to be discussed.



### Hi Jane and Matt

As Matt is aware, there has been some discussion on litter collection and appropriate numbers of bins, and bin sizes. This has occurred among groups of interested people on litter-picking groups.

Could we add an agenda item for considering more or larger bins on Parish Council land. One specific area is Wallsingham Way Park, where I believe there are 2 bins (will check). We are doing other work here which may increase the footfall there too, so this may be the first area to consider.

Other areas might be Shenley Lane Park and, if we manage Napsbury Pavillion open space too.

I take it this would be for the next Environment and Neighbourhood meeting.

I'll monitor complaints and may add to the list of locations.
